## PeaceWomen Across the Globe receives Klaus Jensen Foundation award

The German Klaus Jensen Foundation for civil conflict transformation has honoured PeaceWomen Across the Globe's commitment to women affected by war and conflict with its 2022 Reconciliation Award.

Ruth-Gaby Vermot-Mangold, founder and president of PeaceWomen Across the Globe, will receive the award worth 5000 Euros in Trier, Germany on 30 September 2022. Malu Dreyer, Prime Minister of Rhineland-Palatinate and member of the Foundation Council, will deliver the laudation.

**PeaceWomen Across the Globe** is an internationally active feminist peace organisation based in Bern, Switzerland. It is committed to women's sustainable and visible peace work, networks women in countries and regions affected by war and conflict and supports them in demanding their rights, helping to shape peace processes and thus creating a more peaceful world.

The **Klaus Jensen Foundation**, founded in 2003, promotes local, regional and international violence-prevention projects, mediation and reconciliation. With the Reconciliation Award, the Foundation honours international civil society engagement in the context of civil conflict transformation in crisis regions, making a stand against all forms of violence. By awarding the 2022 Reconciliation Prize to PeaceWomen Across the Globe, the Foundation is drawing particular attention to the concern and commitment of women in war zones.

The Civil Peace Service (ForumZFD) will also be honoured on 30 September for their worldwide commitment to peaceful conflict resolution and will also receive 5000 Euros.
