## Who we are and why we exist

- [PeaceWomen Across the Globe](#) is a peacebuilding organisation based in Bern, Switzerland with international operations. The initiative to nominate 1000 women for the 2005 Nobel Peace Prize marks the beginning of our organisation. Today, we support women in different conflict-affected contexts around the world in their diverse efforts to build lasting peace.
- **What makes us different from other global peacebuilding organisations?** We advocate for a comprehensive understanding of peace and the transformative participation of women at all stages of peace processes. We believe that feminist networks are a powerful tool to increase participation and visibility of women in peace processes.
- This understanding is at the heart of our worldwide **network of Feminists Connecting for Peace**, which evolved from the 1000 Women for the Nobel Peace Prize 2005 initiative.



## The Network

- **Who is in the network?** As of June 2026, we have members from 42 countries around the world, ranging from feminist peacebuilders taking part in high level peace negotiations to less visible grassroots civil society movements operating in remote places. Some members have joined the network 20 years back, others have joined more recently and are representatives from youth movements.



## The Network's added value

- Our members say that the network has the following **added value**:
  - Increased visibility
  - Solidarity
  - Safety
  - Access to knowledge, people and resources
