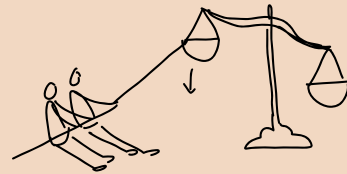

5 LESSONS LEARNED
